Dear Church Family and Friends,

This Sunday we continue our stewardship journey of *Treasure: A Stewardship Program on Faith and Money*. It is based on Jesus' words from his Sermon on the Mount, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:21).

Last Sunday we looked at where we invested our treasures, where we invested our hearts. When we look at where we spend treasure (time, energy, money), that will often lead us to where our heart is invested. This becomes clearer when we take a deep look at our budget and/or our calendar. When we do this, we may begin to notice that our hearts indeed are divided. Maybe we have said yes to too many commitments with our time and/or finances. Whatever we may notice, I imagine we could all use a little streamlining to help us get back to where God is leading us and leading our hearts. We will explore this more fully during worship this week, as we look at what it means to have God be our guide, rather than the things of this world.

At the end of this month, each of us will have the opportunity to make personal commitment of giving to Lyons Community Church for the coming year. We will all receive a commitment card in the mail in the next few days, and the cards will also be available on Sunday mornings. We invite you to prayerfully consider your commitment and bring your completed cards with you to worship on Sunday, September 29th.

We look forward to an exciting month considering the connection between our treasure and God's treasure.





CROP Hunger Walks are community-wide events sponsored by Church World Service and organized by local congregations or groups to raise funds to end hunger at home and around the world.

On October 17, 1969, a thousand people in Bismarck, ND, walked in what may have been the start of the hunger walks related to CROP – and raised \$25,000 to help stop hunger.

Currently, well over 2,000 communities across the U.S. join in more than 1,300 CROP Hunger Walks each year. More than five million CROP Hunger Walkers have participated in more than 36,000 CROP Hunger Walks in the last two decades alone.



CROP Hunger Walks help to support the overall work of Church World Service, especially grassroots, hunger-fighting development efforts around the world. In addition, each local CROP Hunger Walk can choose to return up to 25 percent of the funds it raises to hunger-fighting programs in its own community. Boulder County funds go to Community Food Share and, this year, will also be shared with The ROUND PANTRY at Westview Presbyterian Church.

CROP Hunger Walks help to provide food and water, as well as resources that empower people to meet their own needs. From seeds and tools, to wells and water systems, to technical training and micro-enterprise loans, the key is people working together to identify their own development priorities, their strengths and their needs. This is something CWS has learned through some 68 years of working in partnership around the world.

CROP Walk is an annual fundraising walk (2 mile, 6.21 mile and 10K run) that works to end hunger locally and around the world. Locally raised funds also benefit Community Food Share and its partner agencies such as the ROUND PANTRY. This year's Boulder County CROP Walk will be held at Westview to honor Dennis Hurianek's work as co-chair of the CROP Walk.

Last year, 173 walkers from 17 churches, synagogues and other groups raised \$28,417 in the Boulder County CROP Walk.
